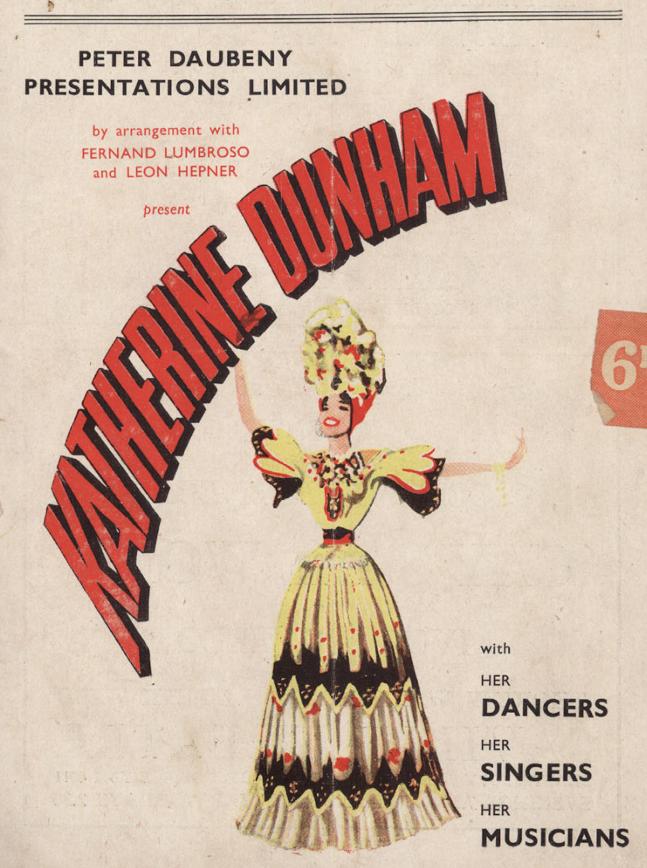

The scene is Vauclin, a tiny 18th-century fishing village in Martinique. Loulouse loves and is desired by Alcide. Julot, his rival, repulsed by Loulouse and filled with hatred and desire for revenge, decides to seek the aid of the King of the Zombies. Deep in the jungle, Julot fearfully enters the lair of the Zombies and witnesses their strange rites which bring the dead back to life. Terrified, but remembering his purpose, Julot pursues the King of the Zombies and obtains from him the "cambois," powerful love charm.

The following evening: it is a time of gaiety, moving into the stately "Creole Mazurka" or "Mazouk" and into the uninhibited excitement of the "Beguine." Into this scene enters Julot, horrifying the villagers when he exposes the coveted "cambois." Even Alcide is under its spell. Now begins the "Majumba," love dance of ancient Africa. As Loulouse falls more and more under the influence of the charm, Alcide suddenly defies its powers, breaks loose from the villagers who protect him, and challenges Julot to the "Ag'ya," the fighting dance of Martinique. In "Ag'ya" and its ending is the consummation of the forces released in superstition and violence.

#### AMERICANA:

Out of the sufferings of slavery came a music rich in rhythms and dances evolved from African origins and overlaid with American forms. The negroes adopted, interpreted and modified many creative expressions of their masters and developed dances of a fresh and extravagant gaiety. In the "Spirituals," however, there is the awareness of tragedy, but with evidences of hope; one of the most pronounced characteristics of negro peoples.
